National Genealogical Society Membership Fact Sheet

National Genealogical Society (NGS) Membership Information:

The National Genealogical Society is a non-profit organization founded in 1903. Membership with NGS offers a number of benefits to help genealogical researchers by providing skills development through education: online genealogy courses, publications, conferences, research trips, and networking opportunities. Membership discounts are offered on all services and products.

In Spring 2018, NGS had nearly 10,000 members throughout the US and a small number internationally. Its membership includes

- more than 9,500 individual members and life members; and
- more than five hundred organizations.

Individual Member and Life Member Dues:

- Annual dues \$70.00 per year
- Additional Family Member dues \$20.00 (some limitations)
- Life Membership dues \$2,500.00

Individual Member and Life Member Benefits:

- Four issues per year of the educational *NGS Magazine*
- Four issues per year of the journal of genealogical scholarship, the *National Genealogical Society Quarterly (NGSQ)*
- Access to the member's only section of the NGS website that includes:
