Its Table of Contents (over) is brimming with topics that will help researchers in many ways, including:

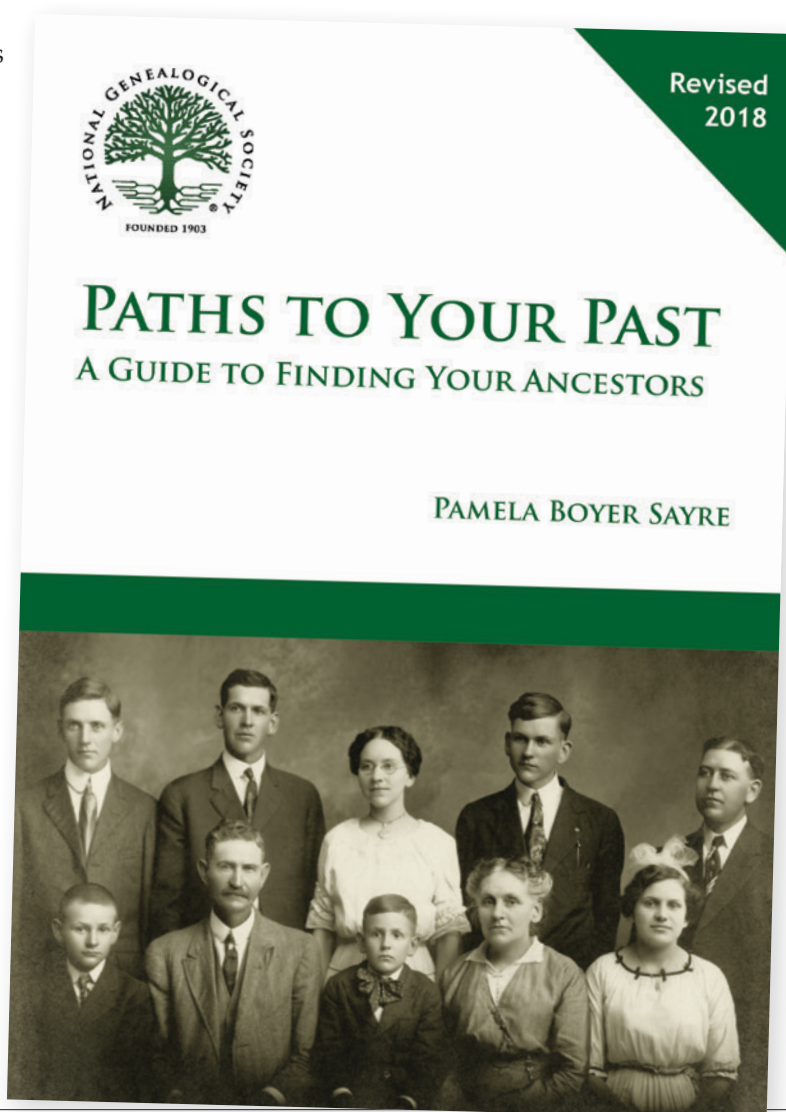
- Using sources on the Internet
